To promote and sustain Wasson Way. A beautiful, accessible and sustainable urban greenway trail for the benefit of the residents of greater Cincinnati.

• Our Vision

Wasson Way will be a world-class urban greenway trail that creates a vibrant hub of community activity, connecting and enhancing neighborhoods, schools and recreation areas across the east side of Cincinnati.

Landscape Design Master Plan Concept

Objective

The Landscape Master Plan concept and Phase 1 design for the Wasson Way in Hyde Park and Oakley, will establish a landscaping design plan for the section of Wasson Way from Marburg Road, extending west approximately 100 feet past Madison Road.



Landscape Design Master Plan Concept

- The plan includes high-level conceptual designs, a design philosophy and set of principles, and a 5-10-year landscape Master Plan that can be built in Phases as described below:
- Phase 1 Design and installation of the landscape plan will be completed in Fall 2021
- Subsequent Phases will be constructed as funding permits and might include:
 - Hardscape features
 - Recreation areas for children
 - Athletic workout course for adults
 - Access to Hyde Park Plaza near Kroger



Landscape Design Master Plan Concept

- The Landscape Committee also requested a conceptual design for four specific areas to be addressed in the Landscape Master Plan. These areas include:
 - Madison Rd. at LaRosa's Pizza next to crosswalk
 - Area between Edwards and Michigan (north of shopping area)
 - Fence line improvements between Monteith Avenue and Paxton Avenue
 - Wasson Way Entry, South of Richards Industrials



Design Principles and Values:



- Access, Safety, and Comfort:
 - Safe physical and psychological access
 - Accentuated trail heads along the Wasson Road greenway corridor, with good visibility at clearly defined traffic crossings
 - Fully multi-generational use for persons of all ages and abilities
 - Maximize natural light while offering a green, cooling park pockets and bench seating



Design Principles and Values:



- Community Fit:
 - Dovetail trail with physical, economic, social, and cultural neighborhoods
 - Connecting campuses and schools, businesses, residences, and senior-living communities
 - Honoring the historical uniqueness of the communities
- Healthy Lifestyle:
 - Provide fitness, wellness, with varying levels of activities for everyone
 - Contact with nature







- Resilience:

Design Focus 1 Madison Rd & Wasson Way










